DESCRIPTION OF GOODS

- berries colour
- white grapes and sultana grapes - from green color to amber colour;
- red grapes - from pink to burgundy (presence of other colors, no more than 10% in one bunch);
- black grapes - from dark blue to black (presence of other colors, no more than 10% in one bunch);
- minimal sugar content: 16° Brix;
- maximal concentration of nitrates - 60.
- maximal degree of shatter: no more than 5% (sultana grapes), no more than 2% - for other varieties. The shatter consist of small parts of grapes bunches which have less then 5 berries, as well as separated whole berries.

CLASSIFICATION / DEFECTS

<p>Grapes of this grade must be characteristic of the variety, allowing for the district in which they are grown. Berries must be firm, firmly attached and, as far as possible, have their bloom intact.</p> <p>The following slight defects, however, may be allowed, provided these do not affect the general appearance of the produce, the quality, the keeping quality and presentation in the package:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • a slight defect in shape; • slight defects in colouring; • very slight sunburn affecting the skin only. 	<p>This grade includes grapes that can't be included in the 1st grade but satisfy the minimum requirements specified in the Introduction. The bunches may show slight defects in shape, development and colouring, provided these do not impair the essential characteristics of the variety, allowing for the district in which they are grown. The berries must be sufficiently firm and sufficiently firmly attached, and where possible, still have their bloom. They may be less evenly spaced along the stalk than in the 1st grade. The following defects may be allowed, provided the grapes retain their essential characteristics as regards the quality, the keeping quality and presentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • defects in shape; • defects in colouring; • slight sunburn affecting the skin only; • slight bruising; • withered vine; • slight skin defects. <p>Tolerances - no more than 10% of the shipment (supply of 1st grade)</p>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • with severe sunburn; • bunches of grapes with small berries (less than 10% of berries in bunches); • dried vine; • with chemical residues; • very thin bunches and berries lost the turgor of peel. <p>Tolerance - no more than 3% of the shipment</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • frost damaged, fermented smell or/and taste; • cracked, crushed fruits; • rotten; • contaminated by mold spores; • with rot of bunch; • with rotten vine; • with signs of scorches from sulfur, as well as thermal scorches; • damaged by pests, by agricultural diseases (oidium, anthracnose and etc.); • withered, shriveled berries.

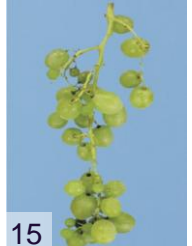
